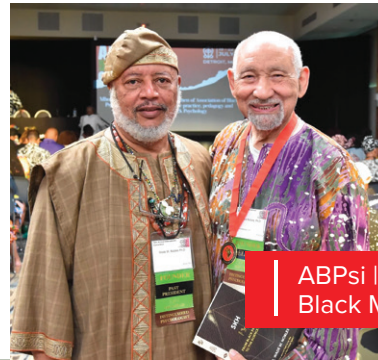

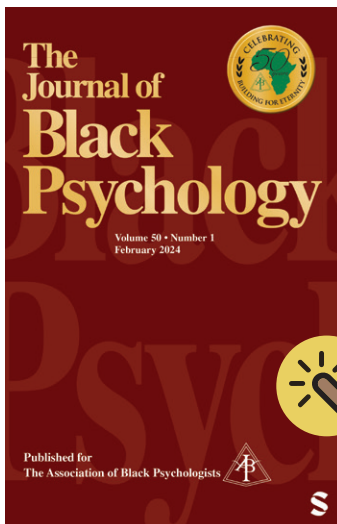
## Our Mission
